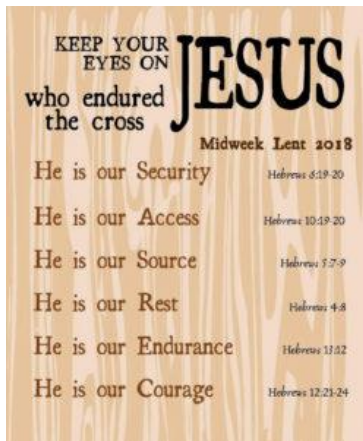




KSJ Fortnightly Flyer

Please do be sure to respect the social distancing requirements whilst waiting for your child to come out of class – especially as the weather warms up.

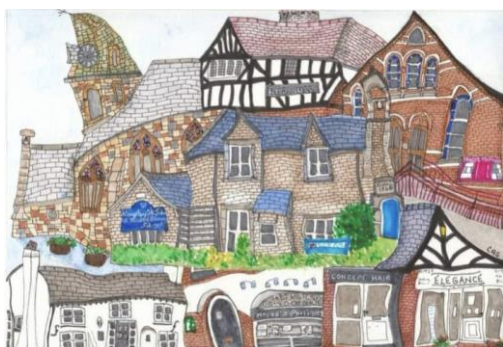
